## Principles of Christian Growth

Section One: The Nature of Christian Growth - What is it?

Lesson Three: Freedom from sin helps us grow.

Bible Reading: Romans 6:1-23, Titus 2:11-15

Paul uses the content of chapter six of Romans to answer an important question: "Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase?" (6:1). The idea is a simple one – since we are saved by grace instead of works (Rom. 4:4-5), and since grace superabounds where sin abounds (Rom. 5:20), why not sin all the more? The answer to that question is simple: freedom from sin helps us grow.

## Discussion questions:

- 1. Paul states that we should not continue in sin because we are dead to sin (v. 2). Our death to sin was accomplished by Christ's death on the cross (vv. 3-7). What is the end result of our sharing in the death of Christ and dying to sin in this way (vv. 6b-7; 18-22)?
- 2. In what sense is our old man crucified with Christ and our body of sin destroyed (v. 6)? Does it mean that we are incapable of sinning? What does it mean?
- 3. How should the truth that we are dead to sin and alive to God through Christ affect the way we live in relation to sin (vv. 11-14)?
- 4. Verse 23 is a well-known verse that speaks of a precious possession of every believer eternal life. How is eternal life obtained? Once obtained, what is also true about that eternal life according to verse 4?
