Section Two: The Means of Christian Growth – How do we do it?

Lesson Four: We grow through confession of sin.

Bible Reading: 1 John 1:5-2:2.

Although we are saved from slavery to sin (remember Section 1, Lesson 3: "Freedom from sin helps us grow"), we still battle an ever present flesh or sinful nature that causes us at times to choose to sin anyway. At times we fail to appropriate the means of grace that give us victory over sin, and so instead we yield to temptation. How we respond to these times of failure will play a very important role in whether or not we will continue to grow in grace in a healthy way. We must confess our sin.
