- 3. Was Adam "the highest of the animals"? Why or why not? (p. 9, ¶ 2).
- 4. Where does the Bible give us God's boundaries for human sexuality, and how does it define those boundaries? (p. 11, ¶ 4-5).
- 5. Who is the third party to every marriage contract, and how does divorce violate our agreement with him? (p. 12, ¶ 1-6).
- 6. What two points are essential to "look[ing] before you leap" into marriage? (p. 13, ¶ 2; p. 14, ¶ 3).

### **Discussion questions:**

- 4. What are the three primary New Testament passages on the roles of husband and wife, and how do they describe each role? (p. 19, ¶ 5; p. 20, ¶ 5, 7).

# Bible reading:

# **Discussion questions:**

- 1. What four truths about the role of the wife in the home can be learned from Eph. 5:21-24? (p. 23, ¶ 5; p. 24, ¶ 2; p. 24, ¶ 4-5).
- 2. Why did Pastor Ashbrook start with Eph. 5:21 in his counselling of married couples? (p. 24, ¶ 1).
- 3. What is *fit* about the role of the wife? (p. 25,  $\P$  3-4).
- 4. Does a certain kind of fear play any role in wifehood? If so, what kind and how so? (p. 26,  $\P$  3).
- 5. Rank the ten directives offered by Pastor Ashbrook for the wife's practice of submission in terms of importance, and then ask your spouse to rank them. How might communication about differences in your rankings contribute to a healthy marriage? (pp. 27-30).

- 3. How do we know that God takes seriously the way a husband cares for his wife? (p. 35,  $\P$  1).
- 4. What is the enemy of leadership? (p. 35,  $\P$  3).
- 5. Rank the twelve directives offered by Pastor Ashbrook for the husband's practice of love in terms of importance, and then ask your spouse to rank them. How might communication about differences in your rankings contribute to a healthy marriage? (pp. 35-38).
